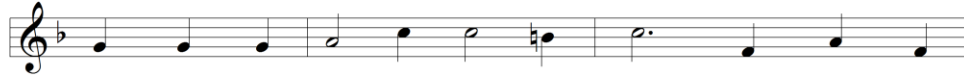

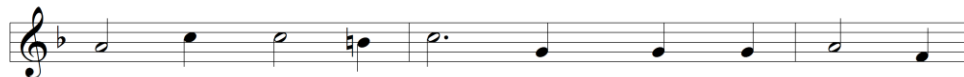

NICENE CREED

Credo

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

We thank you especially for that special Christian who stands at our side and shares our deepest fears and greatest joys.
