He writes about this year's class: "We will begin at Mark 7:31 and cover 7:31 - 9:1. In this section of Mark's gospel there is the beginning of a shift in emphasis from Jesus' deeds that show him to be the Son of God and our Savior to Jesus' words that show him to be the Son of God and our Savior. Beautiful miracles mark the subtle shift in emphasis. Not the least of these is the feeding of the four thousand, a miracle in which Jesus again chooses to need his disciples - - what an honor! What pastor isn't thrilled to note the pattern he exhibits in that choice! Then comes his powerful teaching of the cross that balances the honor, mixed with an emphasis on our total need for him to help us get that balance right in our own minds; without that balance, like the disciples, we loose both the honor of his choosing to need us and as well the ability to bear the cross of his sending. "
