

The Second Week of Advent The Savior Is Coming: Be Prepared to Receive Him

God sent John the Baptizer to prepare the people of Israel for the Savior's coming, and his words still encourage us to be prepared. Whether we celebrate Jesus' first coming at Christmas, his coming to us in Word and sacrament, or his final coming at the end of time, our preparation is the same: we turn away from sin and look to Jesus as Savior.

THE GREAT O ANTIPHONS

The *Great O Antiphons* are seven brief prayers traditionally sung on the seven days before Christmas Eve and are the basis of the Advent hymn, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." Each antiphon begins with the acclamation "O" and addresses Jesus by one of his messianic titles.

PRELUDE

based on VENI EMMANUEL

Stand.

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

O Emmanuel, our King and Lord, the Anointed of the nations and their Savior:

Come and save us, O Lord, our God.

Oh, come, Oh, come, Emmanuel, And ransom captive Israel That mourns in lonely exile here Until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel. O Wisdom, breath of the Most High, pervading and permeating all creation:

Come and make us friends of God.

Oh, come, O Wisdom from on high, Who ordered all things mightily; To us the path of knowledge show And teach us in its ways to go. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

O Lord of lords and leader of the house of Israel, who appeared to Moses in the burning bush and gave him the law on Sinai:

Come and save us with outstretched arms.

Oh, come, Oh, come, great Lord of might, Who to your tribes on Sinai's height In ancient times did give the law In cloud and majesty and awe. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

O Root of Jesse, standing as a signal to the nations, before whom all kings are mute, to whom the nations will do homage:

Come and save us; delay no longer.

Oh, come, O Branch of Jesse's stem, Unto your own and rescue them! From depths of hell your people save, And give them victory o'er the grave. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

O Key of David and Ruler of the house of Israel, when you open, none can close, when you close, no one can open.

Come and proclaim liberty to the captives and set the down-trodden free.

Oh, come, O Key of David, come And open wide our heavenly home. Make safe the way that leads on high And close the path to misery. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

O radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light and Sun of righteousness:

Come and give light to those who live in darkness and the shadow of death.

Oh, come, O Dayspring from on high, And cheer us by your drawing nigh; Disperse the gloomy clouds of night And death's dark shadows put to flight. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

O King of the nations, the ruler they long for, the cornerstone binding all together:

Come and save the people you fashioned from the dust of the earth.

Oh, come, O King of nations, bind In one the hearts of all mankind. Bid all our sad divisions cease And be yourself our King of Peace. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel.
