Trusting in him, I pray:


God, have mercy on me, a sinner.





Help us to find in the testimony of the apostles the realities of your Son's ministry, passion, and resurrection and open doors for us to preach the gospel to the great and the small. Take us where you would have us go, to small islands or great cities, and keep us in safe in your care. As you have blessed the gospel witness of Mark throughout the world, so bring success to our witness that many may come to know your Son and the magnificence of his grace. Lord, in your mercy,
