Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What was going through their minds that evening? They knew about the empty tomb. They had heard Mary Magdalene's eyewitness testimony. Gathered in a room with the doors locked because they were afraid of what the leaders of the Jews might do to them, their heads were likely swimming. They couldn't shake the thought of what they'd done when Jesus was arrested. Though they had promised that they would never forsake him, they all ran away.
