DON'T AVOID

Sometimes we don't know what to say. We have a tendency to avoid when this happens. No one ever knows what to say. Start with a question. A few good ones are listed below to help you out.



They need to talk about it. Get them talking. What is your best memory? What was your relationship with them like?



DON'T BE AFRAID OF SILENCE

Their minds are spinning. Give them time.

"Tell me about your friend... loved one..." What did they think of you?



We want to say something to fix it. We can't. Just listen.

What are you going to miss the most? What days are going to be important for you in the future? Write them down and remember the person on these days.



ASK ANOTHER QUESTION... THEN LISTEN AGAIN

What would you do over with them? What do you wish was different? Just sit with them.
