Welcome to Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary

The forty-five men of the Seminary Chorus and their director are honored by your presence at this concert. We pray that the message proclaimed by our music would strengthen your faith in Christ and both inform and inspire your confession of his saving name.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church is known as the “singing church.” Singing alone, however, does not make Lutherans unique. Most Christians sing at worship. What sets Lutheran singing apart is the purpose attached to our song. Christopher Boyd Brown writes about the unique objective of Lutheran music:

In Roman Catholic and Calvinist thought alike, religious song was primarily a human activity intended to satisfy a debt of worship, whether due to the saints or to God himself... Lutherans regarded their hymns as a form of preaching or proclamation... For Lutherans, the hymns were a form of God’s Word, through which God himself was active to strengthen and comfort his people in faith.¹

Christ and his saving message are at the center of our song. The word of Christ preached from the pulpit is the very same word proclaimed from the pews as Christians confess the creeds and sing the faith. This evening’s program is intended to be a musical devotion on the Apostle’s Creed. The men of the chorus hope to proclaim the chief truths of the Christian faith to you in a way that is lovely, meaningful, and memorable. May Jesus bless our efforts to that end!

Finally, our safety protocols shifted dramatically this week.

- 1 We are no longer under a statewide mask mandate. Instead, the newest CDC guidelines regarding masks and vaccination have been adopted. You are not required to wear a face covering this evening. Instead, it is recommended that you wear one if you are not fully vaccinated.
