





Day 1, Depart U.S.A. to Frankfurt, Germany


Day 2, Arrive Frankfurt, Herzlich Willkommen in Deutschland!

Group transfer to hotel. **Overnight Frankfurt Airport**

Day 3, Worms, Speyer (B)

After our full German breakfast, we begin our day refreshed from our long flight, and ready for our journey through the Lands of Martin Luther. This morning, we meet our professional European Tour Director who will accompany the group to our private motor coach and throughout the tour. We begin our journey along the Reformation Road in the city of Worms. Just a short drive south to the location where Luther was summoned in 1521 to appear before an Imperial Diet to justify his conduct. Professors will lead a guided city walk. Stand in awe as you view the world's largest Memorial to the Reformation and visit the Worms Dom (St. Peter Cathedral) location of the Diet of Worms in 1521, during which Martin Luther was condemned as a heretic, and the Reformation Memorial Church of the Holy Trinitythe largest Protestant church in Worms. Afterwards, we continue our journey along the Reformation Road to the city of Speyer, a UNESCO World Heritage town and also regarded as the birthplace of the Protestant faith for the Protestation at Speyer of 1529. It was here the noble representatives of the princes who were supporters of Luther met at the Diet of Speyer and protested against the ban on Luther's teachings. This protest leads to the division of the Christian faith into Catholic and Protestant. Professors will guide a city walk including visits to the Speyer Dom, neo-Gothic **Gedächtniskirche** (Memorial Church) with its Luther Monument. This evening dinner is on your own at a nearby local restaurant. The tour director can offer suggestions. Overnight Speyer







Throughout your journey, wander through postcard-perfect towns, expand your imagination in the medieval villages of Germany where folklore and history come alive in every street. Let your inner adventurer out as you travel along a magical land full of cultural traditions. Discover the timeless traditions from the making of world-known artisan crafts to the unique winemaking philosophies and wine tastings of some of the finest wines in Germany. Enjoy a tranquil drive through the gentle landscape of budding vineyards and fertile orchards of the wine region.

Feel the breath of history in the 2000year-old city of Worms one of the oldest cities in Germany and location of the largest memorial to the Reformation. Travel along the Reformation Road, home to the most historic sites of Luther's life and work. Walk through the historic places where Luther and Reformers lived, taught and preached. History comes alive in the city of Wittenberg known as "the cradle of the Reformation" and the inspirational town of Speyer, known as the birth place of the Protestant

Experience the allure of Rothenburg, the quintessential medieval city and the most famous town along the famous "Romantic Road". View the Bible scenes depicted in the 500-year old wood-carved altarpiece at St. James Church.

Celebrate J.S. Bach, his immortal organ works and sacred music of the church at the **Bach Fest Leipzig**.

Day 4, Trifels Fortress, Mosel Winery Visit, Trier (B, L)

We will begin our day by observing high mass at the Speyer Dom, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Afterwards, we continue our journey with a guided tour of the Trifels Fortress where Richard the Lionhearted was kept prisoner by the Holy Roman Emperor on his return to England from the Middle East. The Crown Jewels of the Empire were kept here. The original jewels now reside in Vienna. Your journey continues to the medieval city of Trier. Along the way enjoy a drive through the gentle landscape of budding vineyards and fertile orchards of the wine region. The group will visit a local winery including wine tastings and lunch with regional cuisine. This evening we overnight in Trier, Germany's oldest city, founded in 16 B.C. by Roman Emperor Augustus. Professors will lead a guided city walk to explain the Roman, Gothic and Renaissance monuments and churches. Dinner is on your own. Overnight Trier



Professors will lead a guided city walk of Trier including **Basilica of Constantine and the Cathedral District**. A local guide will join the group for our visit to **Porta Negra, Imperial Baths** and of course the Roman ruins! This evening the group will meet for dinner at the hotel. **Overnight Trier**

Day 6, Eltz Castle, Rhine River Cruise, Mainz (B)

This morning the group will enjoy a **guided tour of the Eltz Castle** - one of the most beautiful and best-preserved castles in Germany. It lies in a romantic setting surrounded by an unspoiled landscape - like a fairy-tale castle come to life. After time for lunch, we board the coach for a drive to the pier in St. Goar for a picturesque sightseeing **cruise along the lovely Rhine River** to Bingen, cruising past some of the most picturesque stretches of this majestic waterway. Our group will drive to Mainz for the night. **Professors will lead a guided city walk** and visit **Mainz Cathedral. Overnight Mainz**

Day 7, Eisenach, Wartburg Castle (B)

Today we continue our journey along the Reformation Road to the Luther city of Eisenach. **Professors will lead a guided city walk** to visit **St. George Church**, the **LutherHaus** and the **Bach Museum**, which houses an extensive collection of instruments from the 16th to 19th century and a permanent exhibition on the life and work of J. S. Bach, including a musical performance on historical instruments.











Later this afternoon, a **guided tour of the magnificent Wartburg Castle**. Walk the Luther Way Trail from Eisenach city center or ride the coach to the castle. It was here where Luther took refuge while translating the New Testament into the German language. Our guided tour includes a visit to the Luther Room where "Junker Jörg" translated the Bible. **Overnight Eisenach**

Day 8, Coburg, Rothenburg (B)

Our journey continues as we step even off the beaten-path to the wellpreserved 11th century medieval town of Coburg. Enjoy a self-guided tour of one of Germany's largest castles Veste Coburg, the fortress where Luther took refuge and lived during the drafting of the Augsburg Confession. Stroll the castle rooms at your leisure and be sure to visit the room filled with the beautiful painted walls and ceiling of Cranach the Elder with impressive hunting scenes, magnificent art treasures and the Luther Chapel. After a quick stop for lunch at the castle café, the group will continue on to Rothenburg- the quintessential medieval village and perhaps the most famous town along the "Romantic Road". Professors will lead a guided city walk along the cobblestone lanes with their wonderful variety of shops and medieval architecture. Learn more about the role Rothenburg played in the Thirty Years' War. Visit St. Jakob's Church to view the Bible scenes depicted in the 500-year-old woodcarved altarpiece. Afterwards, time at leisure for a self-guided visit of the Medieval Crime Museum. Overnight Rothenburg

Day 9, Neuendettelsau, Nuremberg (B)

Today we visit the town of Neuendettelsau. **Professors will lead a briefguided city walk** to learn more about the life and faith of Wilhelm Löhe and his influence on American Lutheranism. Afterwards we continue our journey to Nuremburg arriving approx.12:30PM. Enjoy a self-guided visit of the **Germanisches** (German) **National Museum**, home to a large collection of items relating to German culture and art extending from prehistoric times through to the present day. The National Museum is Germany's largest museum of cultural history. Afterwards, **Professors will lead a guided city walk** including views of the Imperial Castle and visits to **St. Lorenz Church**, **St. Sebaldus Church**. **Overnight Nuremberg**

Day 10, Leipzig Bach Festival (B)

This morning we continue our drive north to the majestic city of Leipzig, commonly known as the "city of music"! **Professors will lead a guided city walk** including visits to **St. Nicholas Church**, home of the faithful











"Pray for Peace" Christians, and the powerful force that transformed Germany's East and West, and the magnificent **St. Thomas Church** where Luther preached and Johann Sebastian Bach performed and directed the famous St. Thomas Boys Choir.

This afternoon is at leisure for independent exploration at the **Bach Fest**. Music lovers may enjoy a stroll along the "Leipzig Music Trail" which links the places where composers Bach, Mendelssohn, Schumann, Wagner lived and worked. It was here in Leipzig, that Schiller wrote his immortal "Ode to Joy", later to be adopted as the principal theme of "Beethoven's 9th Symphony", also written in Leipzig. Or perhaps a visit to the Mendelssohn Haus Museum or the Bach Museum, home to the second-largest stock of Bach original in the world! **Overnight Leipzig**

Day 11, Sunday Worship Service ELFK, Torgau (B, D)

This morning group will worship at 9:15AM at St. Trinitasisgemeinde in Leipzig. An ELFK church located at the ELFK seminary. Afterwards, the group departs for Torgau, located on the banks of the Elbe River. Professors will lead a guided city walk including the history of Luther's wife, Katharina von Bora, the house where she lived and died, and St. Mary's Church with its famous Cranach altar and the place of Mrs. Luther's burial. Next, a local guide will join our group to share with us the history of the Hartenfels Chapel, consecrated by Martin Luther and regarded as the first ever Protestant church. And the first embodiment of the Reformation message in architecture and art. Afterwards, enjoy a self-guided visit of the Hartenfels Palace, the best-preserved early Renaissance palace in Germany. Return to Leipzig for dinner at one of the historic restaurants in town, such as Auerbach Keller Restaurant with its Reformation art display on the walls of the "Luther Room" and the "Wine Cellar Room" including a reproduction (only one of its kind, original piece was destroyed) of the Leipzig Debate between Martin Luther and Dr. Eck. Overnight Leipzig

Day 12, Wittenberg, Dresden (B)

Our journey continues along the Reformation Road to Lutherstadt Wittenberg, home to the most historic sights of Luther's life and work. Enjoy a relaxing drive through the German countryside to Wittenberg where you will walk through the historic place where Martin Luther and his fellow reformers lived, taught and preached. Professors will lead a guided city walk including visit to the Castle Church with its historic 95 theses door, the beautiful Town Church with its marvelous Cranach altarpiece and the Lutherhalle Museum Augusteum to view a presentation of some of the important Reformation artifacts from the museum collection (main museum under renovations for 2026). Time at leisure for self-guided visit to Melanchthon Haus Museum. This evening is at leisure for dinner before continuing on to Dresden. Overnight Dresden

Day 13, Dresden (B)

Awake in Dresden, the fascinating city of art and culture. Its magnificent







Baroque buildings and museums featuring world-class art, and its lovely setting on the Elbe, combine to make it a stunning and beautiful city. **Professors will lead a guided city walk** including the Old City, views of the Semper Opera, Court Church, and Zwinger Gallery. This afternoon is at leisure, perhaps a visit to the Zwinger Art Museum housing works of art from the 15-18th centuries, or shopping for local crafts and traditional German products.

This evening attend worship service at the Frauenkirche through organ music, psalm prayer, and spiritual words and a central church tour afterwards. The Frauenkirche Protestant Church was destroyed in 1945 in a massive firebombing so intense the city of Dresden burned for nearly a week. Reconstruction of the church began in 1994 and after many years of rebuilding the church reopened in 2006.

Overnight Dresden

Day 14, Eisleben, Weimar (B, D)

After breakfast the group departs for the Luther city of Eisleben. Professors will lead a guided city walk with visits to the Luther Geburtshaus where Luther was born and Luther Sterbhaus where he died, St. Peter's Church where Luther was baptized, St. Andrews Church where Luther preached his last four sermons, and where his body was laid in state. This afternoon along our way to Erfurt, we stop in Weimar for a brief docent guided visit Herderkirche (City Church of St. Peter and Paul) to view it's famous Cranach altar. Then we continue our journey in the footsteps of Martin Luther to the city of Erfurt, where Luther took the decisive step to turn to theology and the monastic life, when he was caught in a violent thunderstorm nearby and vowed to become a monk. This evening the group will gather for our farewell dinner in Erfurt. Overnight Erfurt

Day 15, Erfurt (B)

Today we awake in the lovely city of Erfurt. **Professors will lead a guided city walk** including the medieval Kramer Bridge, the ensemble of **St. Mary's Cathedral and the Church of St. Severus.** Next, enjoy a **guided tour of the Augustinian Monastery** where Luther lived as a monk from 1505-1511 and where he studied, worshiped and was inspired to create the Luther seal "rose". Dinner is on your own. **Overnight Erfurt** or *Frankfurt depending on departure flight time*.

Day 16, Tour Ends (B)

Group transfer to Frankfurt Airport for flight to U.S.A.

This Agreement effects your legal rights. The lead passenger assumes the responsibility of sharing The Agreement with each passenger in their group, including payment of all amounts when due. It is the responsibility of each passenger to read The Agreement in its entirety. By booking a tour with us, you are accepting and consenting to The Agreement. If you do not agree to the Terms and Conditions, you must not make any booking with us. We may make changes to these terms from time to time.
